What is a "Sharrow"?



A "shared-use arrow" designates that motor vehicles and bicycles are to **share the lane** and is a reminder to drivers to watch for bicyclists.



When is yard waste collected?

Bagged yard waste is taken on the second collection day of the week (Thursday or Friday) by Republic Services.



There will be **regular garbage service** on Monday, January 18, Martin Luther King Day and on Monday, February 15, Presidents' Day.



What size can be left at the side or back of the house for collection?

The can cannot be taller than 42" and everything must be in plastic bags (grocery bags are ok). Any extra bags or boxes not in a can need to be at the road for pick up.
