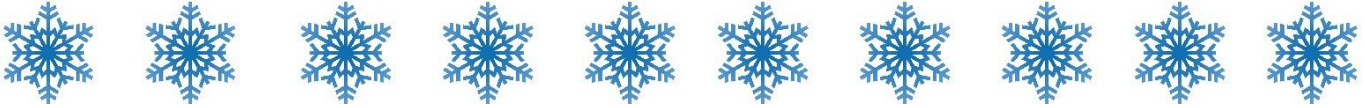

Spring, it appears, is early, and your Public Works staff is not slowing down. Plans are for paving to commence as weather permits to wrap up four major projects begun last year: New Shackle Island final surface, Wessington to be paved and have a new cul-de-sac, Volunteer Drive upgraded, and Stop 30 at Gallatin Road will have the final culvert replaced. We are looking forward to the report for the Pavement Management Program at the end of February. This will help the City to better understand what condition the roads are in city-wide and how best to plan for future maintenance.

Stormwater has also been a major topic with old ordinances revisited and updated. New education videos have been developed for the City and will be posted at the City Youtube Channel. Thanks for all the effort put into the new leaf collection program. We are working to improve it, so comments are appreciated. We are finalizing a limb and leaf policy.

I am looking forward to wrapping these projects up and moving ahead with many more, with the repair or replacement of Fire Hall #2, Sanders Ferry Walking Trail, and several TDOT projects. As always, Public Works will strive to find ways to provide quality projects and service.
