Mike Hudson, 114 Savely Court, addressed the Board stating he has been flooded numerous times since 2009. He stated the Board talks about drainage but needs to do something about it.

E.P. Ausbrooks, 140 Fairways Drive, addressed the Board stating the City has flooding problems and has a responsibility to the citizens to repair the problems.

Michael Crabb, 203 Southburn Drive, addressed the Board stating he has tried to encourage a solution to drainage issues. He cited the debris in the catch basins and the need for the Public Works Department to be made aware of this debris so it can be cleaned out.

Mayor – explained the Board has approved funding drainage improvements in the Southburn Drive and Savely Court areas and will follow the process to move these items forward.



ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS


